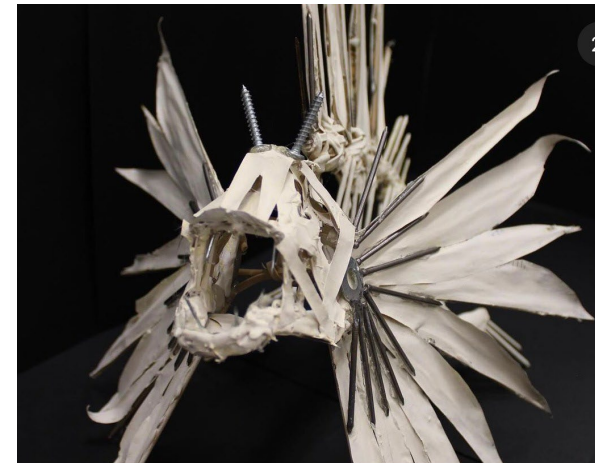
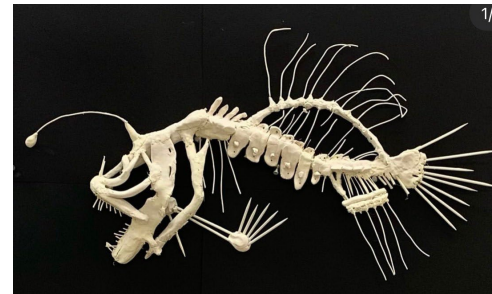


Wire giraffe- (1 piece, two photos on left)
